It is a condition of entry that children should only handle animals where they have the necessary strength and experience to cope with the said animal. Children must always be under the supervision of and accompanied by a competent adult and must be over 8 years of age on 1st January 2012.

All Cattle Exhibitors - Important Notes:

- Due to increased entry numbers it may be necessary for the Show Committee to limit the number of entries per exhibitor. The exhibitor will be notified in writing after the closing date and entry fees refunded accordingly.
- The Show Ground will be open for stock from 7.00am.
- All stock must be prepared by 9.20am for a prompt 9.30am start.
- All prize winning cattle must parade in the Main Ring at 3.15pm.
- In the interests of Health & Safety of the public, stock must not leave the Show before 4.30pm
- Prize Money will be presented together with the rosettes in the ring.
- All trophy winners must collect and sign for trophies from the Cattle Secretaries office after 4pm.
- Exhibitors must obtain prior permission from the Show Secretary if they wish to display or distribute promotional material. Collection boxes for donations to charity are strictly not permitted within the cattle section.
- No children are allowed in the judging rings other than for the calf handling and showmanship classes

Tents and caravans are by permission only and will be allocated a space by the stewards. Strictly no tents in the cattle parking area.

We realise that it is not always possible to provide details of animals to be entered by the closing date of 1st May. We would ask that you provide the details for known entries and, as far as possible, indicate the number of entries you are likely to bring in their class (this helps to allocate stalling). Provide the cattle secretary with the details of animals not previously given on show day. This also applies to substitutes and class changes. After entry closing date if entries of cattle are over subscribed, we reserve the right to limit the number of cattle per exhibitor. Any entry money will be refunded accordingly.

ANIMAL GATHERING ORDER – SHOW LICENCE

1. Any person bringing an animal to the show must register in advance by completing the entry form.
2. Vehicles bringing animals to the show should stay within the designated animal area until they take the same animals home at the close of the show.
3. Vehicles bringing animals to the show must be clean, both inside and out. If a vehicle becomes soiled on route to the show a pressure washer will be available to clean off at the show entrance. Stewards reserve the right to refuse entry to unclean vehicles that are considered a risk to other show entrants.
4. Facilities will be available so that tyres, mudguards and wheel arches can be cleaned and disinfected on vehicles entering and leaving the designated animal area
5. Any person tending or handling animals, or having contact with any equipment which has been in contact with animals or animal products, must wear suitable footwear which can be cleaned and disinfected.
6. Handlers should bring a change of clothing to the show so that this can be changed before leaving the animal area if it becomes soiled. Waterproofs, disposable overalls or white coats can be worn during judging and animal handling. This is not essential as long as clean clothing is put on before the handler leaves the animal area.
7. Handlers, judges and stewards must wash their hands before leaving the animal area.

All Cattle movements to and from shows must be reported to BCMS. Each animal arriving at the showground must have a chequebook style passport (CPP13) or Certificate of Registration (CHR3) or Certificate of Registration and blue/green passport (CPP1)

2. The entry fee must accompany the entry form – cheques payable to Tynedale Agricultural Society. Entry fees are not refundable unless the Society withdraws a class from the published schedule.
3. The Stewards have power to prevent any animal entering the Ring which has been entered contrary to the Rules of each individual section.
4. If any wilful mis-statement is detected in any entry, that entry will be disqualified.
5. Any exhibitor, or his servant, having entered the Judging Ring, may not remove the exhibit before completion of judging, except by permission of the Judge and/or Steward.
6. Animals entering the showground are, in all respects, at the risk of the owner. The Society will not be responsible for any accidents which may occur through any animal exhibited, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. Further, the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage caused to any property of an Exhibitor brought onto the showground. You must ensure that such animals and property are covered by your own insurance.
7. Competent Judges will be appointed by the Committee prior to the day of the show. In each class the Judge shall award First Prize to the exhibit judged best, irrespective of entry numbers.
8. The Society reserves the right to substitute or add to the Judges shown in the schedule
9. No persons other than Judges, Stewards and Attendants of exhibits shall be allowed in the judging areas.
10. Cold water will be provided by the Society – the washing of livestock will be at water stances provided, only.
11. Any person who feels they have a grievance, must lodge their objection in writing to the Secretary by 5 pm on the day of judging. The objection must be accompanied by a deposit of £5. The Committee, whose decision shall be final, will meet to consider the protest. If the objection is not upheld the deposit will be forfeited.
12. The Showground will be open from 7 am and all exhibits should be prepared for judging at the time applicable to that section.
13. Stock may not leave the Showground before 4.30pm. Prize money will be presented in the ring together with the rosettes. Any discrepancy with prize money must be reported to a steward at the time of presentation.
14. Health – Animals affected with any disease of an infectious or contagious nature, or animals out of an infected herd, are strictly prohibited from being brought onto the premises used or occupied by the Society at that time.
15. Livestock vehicles, trailers, cars etc must not be left in livestock lines or roadways but removed to an area allocated for that purpose.
16. Any exhibitor proved to have contravened any of the Society's Regulations will forfeit prize money and/or trophies.
17. Winners of Trophies must return them to the Secretary by May 1st in the following year.
18. Specific Regulations governing individual classes are printed in the appropriate sections of the Schedule
19. Exhibitors are responsible for displaying the correct catalogue number and being forward for judging.
